THE OLD TESTAMENT: **Baruch 5:1-9**

- Take off the garment of your sorrow and affliction, O Jerusalem, and put on forever the beauty of the glory from God.
- Put on the robe of the righteousness that comes from God:

put on your head the diadem of the glory of the Everlasting;

- for God will show your splendor everywhere under heaven.
